## **DISTANCE EDUCATION**

Distance Education course delivery is considered to be a viable and necessary course delivery alternative for certain low enrollment high school options in the high school program. This delivery method will attempt to maximize personnel expertise and personnel efficiency, so as to provide the greatest possible course opportunity for the students of our high schools. It is an attempt to do "more with the same".

Distance Education courses are defined as those learning opportunities that employ a varied multi-media or internet based approach, depending on the course, so as to transmit interactive instruction from one location to multiple geographically separate locations. Media employed will vary depending on the nature of the course, the instructor and/or availability of equipment.

- 1. Traditional Print Courses: A student who is enrolled in the school and wishes to opt for a print correspondence course may do so, if he/she cannot be timetabled into that particular course, or if that course is not offered in the school.
- 2. On-Line Courses Developed by Other Divisions and/or Manitoba Education: These will be made available as now is currently done with traditional correspondence courses. Students will fit in as possible, given their schedules and the school's ability to provide the necessary facilities and providing that the school's parameters regarding students taking correspondence courses are fulfilled.

Note: Tuition Fees: The fees are the responsibility of the student. Under special circumstances, the Division may cover the costs upon successful completion of the course.
