

It's hard to believe we're already at the end of November! Although we've had some continued challenges this year, I'm happy to report that we have been able to return to playing middle years sports! We recently wrapped up our **Volleyball** season, as we were able to take place in two local tournaments: the Rick McElroy Invitational on Saturday, November 6th, as well as Valley Champs on Wednesday, November 24th. A big thank-you goes out to the staff at ESRSS for allowing our teams to utilize their building for a safe and fun couple of events. So, how did the team do? Pretty good actually! All that 4 square volleyball we've played in P.E. class apparently paid off. The Cobras finished 2nd overall in their pool at the Rick McElroy tournament, and finished 1st overall in their pool at Valley Champs! Now, what have we been doing in P.E. class?

With fitness testing coming to an end, all grade 3-8 classes have recently started a mini-volleyball unit in the gym. In a nutshell, for mini-volleyball we use the badminton nets (with pvc pipe extensions) rather than the normal volleyball net. With the height of the net being much lower, I find this is great for skill development across all grade levels. Also, where traditional volleyball is played with 6 players on the court, in mini-volleyball

we are able to limit the amount of players on each team to anywhere between 1-3 people. This allows more contacts during games, and allows us to socially distance properly. We have played many variations of volleyball including: 4 square, under the net, one bounce/one catch, no bounce/one catch, as well as more traditional 2 v 2 games with the older students. Adaptations with the ball played include using balloons, the omniken ball, lighter trainer volleyballs, as well as the Mikasa game volleyballs. Hopefully, our improving skills and enjoyment for the game carries over to next year when all grade 5-8's can get back on the court and represent Benito School!

Lastly, we recently received a large container from our SVSD maintenance department. While I keep telling the younger ones it contains Bigfoot, it's actually our **Cross Country Skis**. With that in mind, we will be heading back outside when we can (starting early December) for possible activities such as cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, geocaching, as well as some outdoor broomball. Please have your child bring appropriate clothing for these activities. This would include things like winter jacket and ski pants, winter gloves, a toque, as well as proper winter footwear. This will continue into the month of January.
