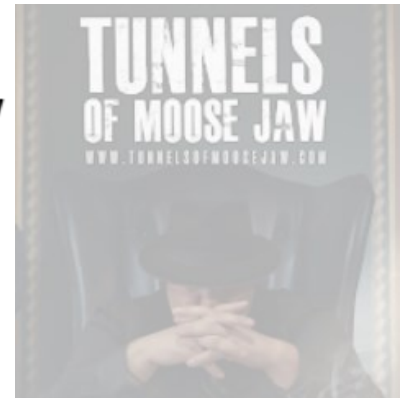
Grade 7/8 Greenhouse Experience
