École Swan River South School is a Kindergarten – Gr. 8 School serving approximately 275 students. We offer a French Immersion program for K– Gr. 8 students and an English program for Gr. 6, 7 and 8 students.

Attendance

All students are encouraged to attend school regularly to ensure academic success.

PLEASE NOTIFY THE SCHOOL IF YOUR CHILD WILL BE ABSENT

Unconfirmed absenteeism for students (K-8) will be followed up by school personnel.

The division follows an attendance policy called the Swan Valley School Division Student Attendance Policy and Protocol. The goal of this policy is to ensure that SVSD students are supported in developing and sustaining healthy attendance patterns. This new policy can be viewed at www.svsd.ca.

Emergency Closing of School

It is advisable for parents/guardians to listen to radio station CJGX (Yorkton 940) or CJ104 (local radio), or check the school division website www.svsd.ca for information regarding school closure or bus cancellations, especially during inclement weather.

Electronic Devices

School provided electronic devices can be used as learning tools at ESRSS. **Cell phones as well as any form of personal communication device are not permitted for use at school in accordance with provincial cell phone guidelines. Students are encouraged to leave their devices at home during the school day. Cell phones or other devices that come to school should be stored in student lockers for the day.**

Dress Code

We are all expected to dress and groom ourselves in a manner that reflects pride and respect for self and for the school. Any type of attire which attracts undue attention to the wearer, is unduly revealing, unsafe or causes a disturbance is considered unacceptable. As a general guideline, students are asked not to wear clothing that exposes underwear, the midriff, or contains offensive or inappropriate content.

Student Behaviour

École Swan River South School is a peaceful school committed to the growth and development of the student within a safe learning environment. We expect our students and adults to be respectful and cooperative as we all strive to do our best.

ESRSS has been working with the Restitution Self Discipline model for the past few years. Restitution is an approach to discipline that aims to support all people to fix their mistakes, learn from the experience and return to the community strengthened and confident. Please refer to the ESRSS school website where three key elements of Restitution are provided; Basic Needs, ESRSS School Belief Matrix and ESRSS Bottom Lines.



Bus Use

Bus transportation provided by the School Division is a **PRIVILEGE** and certain rules prevail. Misbehaviour while riding or loading buses may result in suspension and/or being dropped from the school bus roster.

Any student who wishes to ride on a bus other than the one assigned, or any student wishing to ride on a bus to a friend's place, **MUST HAVE A NOTE DATED AND SIGNED BY PARENT/GUARDIAN** requesting such a privilege.



Lunch Break

EATING LUNCH IN SCHOOL IS A PRIVILEGE. This privilege can be denied to a student who displays inappropriate behaviour in a lunch room. Students having to eat lunches at school are assigned to homerooms. Lunch students **MUST** remain on the school premises during the noon hour.

Students in K to 8 must have written permission to leave the school grounds during the lunch break. Sunflower seeds, Slurpee's and energy drinks are not allowed in the school.

A School Milk Program is available for K-8 students.

Recesses

Students in grades K-6 will be required to go outside for all recess breaks including lunchtime. Grade 7/8 students are encouraged to go outside for all recesses but do have the option to remain in school and use the library or gymnasium.

It is imperative that children are dressed appropriately for weather conditions at any time of the year.



Medication in the School

School Board Policy states that, "School personnel shall avoid being dispensers of medicinal drugs unless it is necessary for the physical/mental health or safety of the child."

NO MEDICATION IS ALLOWED IN THE SCHOOL UNLESS PARENTS HAVE PROPER FORMS COMPLETED. (Forms are available at the school office).

The school may provide, as a service, non-prescription Tylenol under the following situations:

1. That there is parental authorization in writing or by telephone, duly noted.
2. That the dispensing of these non-prescription drugs will occur only through designated office personnel so that the frequency per student can be monitored.

Safe Keeping of Students' Possessions

Lockers and locks are available to grade 6-8 students. Students are encouraged to keep their lockers locked at all times to safeguard personal belongings.

Lost items should be reported to the general office where "found" items are kept. Students' possessions should be clearly marked with their names. All unclaimed articles are donated to charity.

Evaluation of Student Progress

During the school year students have three reporting periods - November, March and June. For the first two reporting periods, parents/guardians, and **students are encouraged to attend** Parent/Teacher Conferences. Please watch the ESRSS website where updated information will be provided.

Expectations for successful completion of a subject are described in each subject teacher's course outline. Parents are encouraged to contact the school at any time to request a review of their child's academic progress.

Awards

Awards are given out each year to grade 8 students at our Farewell ceremony. Awards included are subject specific achievement awards as well as specific area awards.



Communication

Please visit our school website regularly for school events and information. Our School Messenger system will be utilized as much as possible to support the release of information updates. Parents wishing to leave messages for their children are encouraged to phone the main office and speak to one of our secretaries.



Fire, Tornado & Lockdown Drills

Fire, Tornado & Lockdown Drills are held frequently so that in the event of a real emergency we can respond in the best manner to ensure everyone's safety.



Computer Usage

Our school's computers are available for use by classes on a regularly scheduled basis or for occasional use as needed. Students are expected to respect the equipment and materials provided.

~*E-mail* – only school assigned E-mail addresses may be used in the school.

~ *Printing* - is generally restricted to single print-outs of assignments. Permission must be sought from the supervising teacher for any other printing.

~ *Responsible use of the Internet is expected of students.* Specific guidelines will be provided by the teacher.



Parent Council

ÉSRSS has two parent councils. ÉSRSS PAC-(Parent Advisory Council) and CPF-(Canadian Parents for French). The following is an overview of the parent councils.

The PAC (Parent Advisory Council) is a group of interested parents of Kindergarten to Grade 8 students from both French and English programming. The PAC supports all of our students and staff to enhance their experience at ÉSRSS. We presently do this through the purchase of digital cameras and sports team jerseys, special lunches, financial assistance for special request and by assisting with the fiddling program.

CPF (Canadian Parents for French) is a group of interested parents of students in the French programs. CPF works in our school to promote the French language and culture through initiatives like movie nights, bingo nights, and dances, en Français. We also assist with the ÉSRSS annual Festival du Voyageur celebrations, financial support for class cultural trips, cultural activities, and theatre and drama workshops. We promote CPF – MB activities such as French language speaking and singing competitions.

Our school emphasizes programs that will provide students with opportunities to gain the skills, knowledge and attitudes to be productive citizens.

As a student at ÉSRSS, you should take full advantage of your right to an education.

Students should come to school with a positive attitude towards learning and participating in school activities.

An important part of your education is your learning to make appropriate decisions. To protect your rights and the rights of others, a student behaviour guideline has been established.
