**About Us**: Minitonas School is a K-8 school. We have a teaching staff of 9.0 FTE. The Resource teacher and Principal have teaching duties. 8 educational assistants work with students throughout the grades. All classes have ample time allotments in music, and physical education classes. Library time is on the timetable for each class, as well as for individuals as needed. Knowing students by name, needs, and interests is possible within our school with population being low.
