No Drugs or **Bullying:** any behaviour that causes fear, humiliation, distress, or other harm to a person's feelings, self-esteem, body, or reputation. Bullying is usually a repeated behaviour.

Harassment: any behaviour that degrades, demeans, humiliates, or embarrasses a person, and that a reasonable person should have known would be unwanted. Harassment is usually repeated conduct or comments. Examples include sexual or racial harassment.

T—Talk it out

S—Seek adult help
