

Truth and Reconciliation

Every Child Matters (September 30th) is a day when we honour the Indigenous children who were sent away to residential schools in Canada. The annual event is a chance to have meaningful discussion about the effects of Residential Schools and the legacy they have left behind.

The 'orange shirt' refers to the new shirt that Phyllis Webstad was given to her by her grandmother for her first day of school at St. Joseph's Mission residential school (1973) in British Columbia. When

Phyllis got to school, they took away her clothes, including her new shirt. It was never returned.

In her own words:

"The colour orange has always reminded me of that and how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and how I felt like I was worth nothing. All of us little children were crying, and no one cared."



On September 30th, in the spirit of healing and reconciliation, we need to pass on the message that **EVERY CHILD MATTERS**, - EVERY DAY.


