Course Title: Advanced Haircutting and Chemical Texture 40S

Course Description: This course focuses on advanced haircutting, and the theoretical and practical application of chemical smoothing and relaxing of hair. Students will also demonstrate two services on Afro texture and other natural hair types.

General Learning Outcomes:

- Students will demonstrate preparing their client for services throughout client consultations, as well as sanitation, health and safety practices
- Students will study practical and theoretical work of chemical texture services and chemical hair relaxers
- Students will continue to build upon design specific wrapping patterns
- Students will advance their skills in thermal styling and wet setting
- Students will demonstrate chemical smoothing, relaxing, and giving soft curls to hair on models
- Students will advance their skills in hair cutting, customizing and texturizing various haircuts
