***ALL assigned work is due and expected. No course credit will be granted unless all assessments/required items are submitted. "Taking a zero" is an unacceptable option. Having said that, late assignments, while still expected, will receive a zero grade if they are submitted after a unit of study time has passed.

***Students with an average score of < 50% or a significant number of unaccounted for absences may be denied the opportunity to write the final exam at the discretion of the instructor. Students who do not write the exam cannot receive course credit unless other arrangements are made with SVRSS administration.

Assessment Guidelines (formative / summative):

Students will be evaluated formatively (for learning) on an ongoing basis by the instructor. These assessments will not count toward grades and will not be recorded in PowerSchool. Grades in PowerSchool should be regarded as summative assessments (evaluating learning), and as such, will appear in PowerSchool.

Learning Behaviours:

Students are encouraged to be present, both physically and mentally, and to always try their best. Interaction with lessons and questions, as well as participating in conversations during class instruction are always encouraged.

Classroom Expectations:

- ✓ It is YOUR responsibility to complete the notes and activities if you have missed a class. It is expected that you will complete these steps, so you are not behind in the class. If anything is unclear, clarify with another student in the class or with the teacher.
- ✓ Communication will be via Teams in the form of Posts to all the students in the class or individually to students when needed. Ensure that notifications are enabled on your Team for this class, so you can check for any updates during breaks or at lunch. School email may also be used for communication. If class is cancelled due to weather, students are expected to check the Team for information regarding the expectations for the day.
- ✓ Please come to class prepares! Once seated in the classroom, students should open their books to the previous day's assignment, have their booklet ready and their textbook turned to the assignment page from the day before.
- ✓ Only 1 student is permitted to leave the classroom at a time with the TEACHER'S PERMISSION and must use the sign out form by the door when leaving and again upon their return.
- ✓ Students will be dismissed by the teacher, not the school's bell system. Students are required to remain seated prior to dismissal.
- * Any additional re-do opportunities exist only at the discretion of the instructor.

Missing Tests:

Any student missing an important assessment like a test may be required to be assessed with an alternate and possibly more challenging assessment. Missing an assessment with parental permission, illness, field trip, etc. may still result in an alternate assessment.
