Course Title: Intermediate Hairstyling and Artificial Hair 30S

Prerequisites: Intro to Hairstyling, Basic Hairstyling, Related Salon Services, Basic Haircutting & Thermal Styling

Course Description: Curriculum content focuses on wigs and hair enhancements, and the continued development of wet and thermal hair styling techniques.

General Learning Outcomes:

- Students will demonstrate preparing their client for services throughout client consultations, as well as sanitation, health and safety practices
- Students will study practical and theoretical work of artificial hair including wigs and various types of hair extensions
- Students will demonstrate proper wig care and styling
- Students will gain knowledge on maintenance and care of artificial hair
- Students will demonstrate thermal styling and wet setting on models at an intermediate level

3. Wigs and Hair Enhancements
4. Hair Extension Project
