Course Title: Intro to Hairstyling 20S

Prerequisites: None

Course Description: Curriculum content focuses on an introduction to hairstyling. Students are introduced to safety and sanitation, basic tools and equipment, the operation of a hairstyling salon, the workings of the hairstyling industry, and introductory hairstyling skills.

General Learning Outcomes:

- Students will demonstrate preparing their client for services throughout client consultations, as well as sanitation, health and safety practices
- Students will study practical and theoretical work of wet setting, blow-drying and thermal irons
- Students will demonstrate braiding on long hair
- Students will gain knowledge on basic foundations for up-dos
- Students will learn about various brushes and tools used in industry
- Students will demonstrate a basic shampoo, condition and blow dry on a real model
