Prerequisites: Intro to Hairstyling, Basic Hairstyling

Course Description: Curriculum content focuses on manicures, ear piercing, superfluous hair removal, sun tanning, and an introduction to the practical application of perm wrapping and hair colour techniques.

General Learning Outcomes:

- Students will demonstrate preparing their client for services throughout client consultations, as well as sanitation, health and safety practices
- Students will study practical and theoretical work of manicures and nail diseases/disorders
- Students will demonstrate eyebrow waxing
- Students will gain knowledge on practical applications of perm wrapping
- Students will learn about basic hair coloring
- Students will demonstrate ear piercing
